INTRODUCTION:

Humans have been coping with natural disasters since time immemorial. There are so many disasters which cannot be controlled by human intervention. Due to human intervention in the natural processes, the destructive power and frequency of natural disasters have increased considerably. The vulnerability of environment has been increasing continuously due to human activities. But this is not one sided relationship. Humans are also the components of the environment. Hence they can't escape from the effects of environmental change processes. When local, regional or global processes of environment pose danger to humans or their property, they are simply natural events.

India is a developing country and prone to a number of natural hazards. Among all the natural disasters that country faces, river floods are the most frequent and often devastating. Floods have been a recurrent phenomenon in India and cause huge losses to lives, properties, livelihood systems, infrastructure and public utilities. So floods are a natural and inevitable phenomenon of life in almost all the states of India. Floods depend on many things such as Climate, nature of the Collecting basin, nature of the streams, soil, and vegetative cover, amount of snow melt and over all rainfall. Year to year variations occur are, noted with regard to climate and rainfall pattern along with floods. Even inadequate capacity of the rivers to contain the high water flows coming down from the upper catchment area following heavy rainfall leads to high floods.


Almost every year floods of varying magnitude affect some parts of the country or the other. Different regions of the country have different climates and rainfall patterns and, therefore, while some parts face devastating floods, other parts may, at the same time, experience drought conditions. The monsoon regime is a regular phenomenon. Year-to-year variations occur with regard to the onset of the monsoon, its progress over the Indian landmass, and the amount of rainfall distribution. In some years the variation is quite significant. Nevertheless, there is a fundamental regularity and dependability about the monsoon that sets the seasonal rhythms of life, although it also causes unfortunate losses across much of this part of the world.

Floods being the most common natural disaster, people have, out of experience, devised many ways of coping with them. However, encroachments into the flood plains over the years have aggravated the flood problem and a need to take effective and sustained FM measures has been felt. Various measures, structural and nonstructural, have been taken by the central and state governments and as a result, considerable protection has been provided to the people.

Contingency planning is the identification, prior to a disaster, of all critical procedures and resources necessary for the organizations survival. The purpose of such a program is to anticipate, and plan for these emergency situations before they arise, thus lessening their effects. Such planning is a management tool, involving all sectors, which can help ensure timely and effective provision of humanitarian aid to those most in need when a disaster occurs. Time spent in contingency planning equals time saved when a disaster occurs. Effective contingency planning should lead to timely and effective disaster-relief operations.

<u>OBJECTIVES OF THE PLAN:</u> Developing a contingency plan involves making decisions in advance about the management of human and financial resources, coordination and communications procedures, and being aware of a range of technical and logistical responses. It involves making decisions in advance about the management of human and financial resources, coordination and communications procedures, and being aware of a range of technical and logistical responses. In order to achieve the Mission, the objectives of the plan have been set as:

- i) Systematic arrangement and deployment of resources
- ii) To reduce the impact of flood disaster.
- iii) Information, such as timely flood forecasts and warnings.
- iv) The provision of basic needs, such as shelter and medical
- v) Supply of drinking water, sanitation and food during floods.
- vi) Disruption of economic activities; Effective coordination
- vii) Urgent restoration of critical infrastructure and measures to be taken to bring normalcy immediately after the flood
- viii) To co-ordinate the relief activities by drawing up operational plan with all concerned departments/ agencies / NGOs to evolve a common plan for response.
- ix) To prepare list of buildings, Community Centres, Halls, Schools to be opened as temporary relief centres.
- x) To identify the list of susceptible places likely to be cut off or submerged during floods.
- xi) To identify high land / raised platforms for human and cattle shelter.
- xii) To Ensure flow of communication network, proper weather forecasting, warning level of the rivers, both upstream and downstream and developing an accurate warning mechanism.
- xiii) To ensure sufficient stock of essential commodities/ food stock and other essential items with proper storage facilities for immediate dispersal.
- xiv) To identify all vulnerable roads/ bridges/embankments prone to damage and preparation immediate measures for restoration of road links.



DISTRICT PROFILE, HOJAI:

Hojai district with its head quarter at Hojai town is spread across 1685 sq. kms within 26°00′ North latitude and 92°87′ East longitude. It was part of the Nagaon district until 15 August 2015 when it became a new district of the state. It is surrounded by the foot hills of East & West Karbi Anglong and Dima hasao district in the east, west and southern side and Nagaon district lies in the northern and western side. Total population of the district is 929094 (2011 census). With relatively high annual rainfall (253.53 mm) and the soil type in this region is clay loamy. The *major rivers* flowing through the district, which also causes annual floods and riverbank erosion etc., particularly in the char areas, leading to a considerable loss of life and property are **Kopili** and **Jamuna river**. Other minor rivers which also contribute to cause floods and riverbank erosion are Khringkhring river, Lumding river, Dimoru river, Nikhari river etc.

(a) Origin of the Name Hojai:

Hojai was a part of <u>Dimasa</u> Kachari Kingdom in medieval times. According to Ahom Buranjee, Dimasa Kachari Kingdom stretches from Dikhu river to Kolong river. The Dimasa Kacharies living in Hojai are known as "Hojai- Kacharies" to others. "Hojai" is one of the clans (Sengphongs) of Dimasa tribe, probably The city "Hojai" got its name from this clan. It was made a subdivision on 15 August 1983 under Nagaon district and after 32 years on the same date it was declared a new district of the state.

There are a number of small scale industries in Hojai, it is also known for its trade hub, there are also lots a of big markets with much of monopoly and competition prevailing as there is boom in all trades.

(b) Location, General Boundaries, Total area and Population:

The Hojai Circle which is situated on the south west bank of the Dimru river occupies a central geographical position in the in the Entire district. The circle lies between Latitude 26°/N and 92°/E Longitudes. On the north it is bounded by the Doboka Rev Circle & Nagaon District, on the east by Lanka Rev Circle & East Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council and on the west of the district by west Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council.

The total population of Hojai Circle is **228,530** out of which urban population is **61,045** while rural is **167,485**. As per Census 2011, total families in Hojai were **11,634**. As per Census 2011 out of total population, 26.7% people lives in Urban areas while 73.3% lives in the Rural areas. The average literacy rate in urban areas is 86.1% while that in the rural areas is 76.2%. Also the Sex Ratio of Urban areas in Hojai Circle is 952 while that of rural areas is 957.

The population of Children of age 0-6 years in Hojai Circle is 34242 which are 15% of the total population. There are 17317 male children and 16925 female children between the ages 0-6 years. Thus as per the Census 2011 the **Child Sex Ratio of Hojai Circle is 977** which is greater than Average Sex Ratio (956) of Hojai Circle.

The total literacy rate of Hojai Circle is 78.93%. The male literacy rate is 71.79% and the female literacy rate is 62.2% in Hojai Circle.

(a) River System and WaterResources

- i) The Kopili River: The Kopili River which rises in the Jaintia Hills (Meghalaya) flows north and north-east winding through the Jaintia Hills and North Cachar Hills. It is joined by the Doiang River below the foothills and the combined channel flows in a north-westerly direction. At Jamunamukh in Nagaon district it is met by its eastern tributary the Jamuna and flows past Raha after taking a westerly turn. Here it is joined by a branch channel with the Kolong River and at Jagiroad, it finally meets the main stream of the Kolong after a course of 262 Kms. from its origin.
- the Khanbamun hills in Karbi Anglong District and flows from east to west for a length of 120 Kilometers and falls in the Kopili near Jamunamukh. The river is fed by several small tributaries namely the Lenghit, Disama, Disa, Dighalpani, Dikharu, Buriganga, Dimaru etc.

FLOODS IN HOJAI CIRCLE

Hojai Revenue Circle is partially flood prone circle. There are all total 103 villages in this circle, out of which 55 village are located in the flood prone zone. From past history, it is seen that this circle had experienced-05 major floods during last 20 years. During those floods, many areas were badly affected and some areas were submerged by flood water and affected families had to be shifted to different relief campus. Communication got disrupted in some places and G/R was distributed among the affected population. In 2010, in the month of August (1st wave) in the month of October (2nd wave) a flash flood occurred in the Jamunachit area and affected around 15000 families (Approx). This Circle also experienced the have flood which occurred in the year 2004, which lasted for the longest period. The major source of flood to this Circle is river Kapili, river Jamuna, river Dimru. The total no. of affected population for the probable flood may be estimated at 40,000 to 42,000. To combat with the flood, particularly for smooth conduct of relief and rescue operation during the flood period in Hojai Revenue Circle, a circle level committee is proposed to be formed with the Circle Officer, Hojai as chairman and the other members of this committee will be formed within the local heads of the Govt. officers of various Departments representatives of the Panchayat and Zila Parishad, leading citizens, members of voluntary organization of Hojai Revenue Circle Area. The flood prone areas have been identified from previous records and these areas have been divided into 4 (Four) zones for smooth conduct of relief and rescue operation. Each Zone will be given in the charge of one responsible govt. officer of Hojai Revenue Circle area. He/She will be overall charge of smooth functioning of relief and rescue operation. He/She will keep close contact with the Circle Officer as well as Circle Level Relief Committee and take timely action according to the need of the situation. All the Gaonburah, and VDP members of this committee. They will render all possible help to the committee as per demand of the hour.

BACKGROUND OF FLOOD IN DOBOKA REVENUE CIRCLE

The Doboka Revenue Circle is prone to devastating flood, which is quite evident from the last past history. The major rivers that flows in and around Doboka Revenue Circle are- Jamuna river, Kapili river, Dimaru river along with there several tributaries. The circle comprises of 108 Revenue villages and 01 (one) Non Cadastral village out of which 50 villages are likely to be affected in case of flood situation. A brief history of last 20 years shows that, the circle has undergone 5 major flood hazards which led to severe damages of properties, communication, agriculture and loss of livestock's etc. affecting the Social- economic culture of the Society. During flood major part of the Revenue Circle remains submerged by flood water and the measures were adopted in due course to shift and shelter the affected families in different relief camps situated in comparatively high land areas, such as high raised platforms, schools and railway platform etc. and gratuitous reliefs were also distributed among the flood affected people residing in the camps at the evoke of such crucial situations. In addition, measures were also taken for sanitary facilities, safe drinking water and disinfectant packets were also distributed to keep the surrounding environment safe and clean.

It is estimated that approximately 1,15,958 population are vulnerable to probable flood. To combat with such situation and for smooth conduct of relief and rescue in Doboka Revenue Circle, a Circle Level Committee is proposed to be formed comprising of the circle Officer, Doboka as Chairman and the local head of the Govt. Officers of various Depts., representatives of Panchayat and Zila Parisha, leading citizens of Doboka Revenue Circle as members.

The flood prone areas have been identified from previous records and these areas have been divided in 3 sectors namely Jamunamukh Mouza, Kapahbari Mouza and Na-mati Mouza. Each sector will be headed by a responsible senior Govt. officer of Doboka Revenue Circle. He will be responsible for smooth and effective management of flood relief and rescue operations. He/ she will keep close liaison with the Circle Officer as well as with the Circle Level Disaster Management Committee adequate measures according to the need of the situation. All the Gaonburha and VDP members are also member of this committee and they shall render all possible help to the committee as per demand of the hour.

(a) River System and WaterResources

- i) The Kopili River: The Kopili River which rises in the Jaintia Hills (Meghalaya) flows north and north-east winding through the Jaintia Hills and North Cachar Hills. It is joined by the Doiang River below the foothills and the combined channel flows in a north-westerly direction. At Jamunamukh in Nagaon district it is met by its eastern tributary the Jamuna and flows past Raha after taking a westerly turn. Here it is joined by a branch channel with the Kolong River and at Jagi, It finally meets the main stream of the Kolong after a course of 262 Kms. from itsorigin.
- ii) **The Jamuna River:** The Jamuna River, the main tributary of the Kopili originates from the Khanbamun hills in Karbi Anglong District and flows from east to west for a length of 120 Kilometers and falls in the Kopili near Jamunamukh. The river is fed by several small tributaries namely the Lenghit, Disama, Disa, Dighalpani, Dikharu, Buriganga, Dimaruetc.

FLOODS IN DOBOKA CIRCLE

In the year 2004 three devastating waves of flood occurred and created havoc among the vulnerable population of the district. In that year, flood waters of Kopili inundated many areas in Kampur, Raha and Hojai District's circles. Jamuna River also inundated areas in Doboka circle of Hojai district disrupting road communication between Doboka and Diphu. Army help has been sought for restoration. In the district about one lakh people have been affected by the flood in the year 2004.

BACKGROUND OF FLOOD IN LANKA REVENUE CIRCLE

The Lanka Revenue Circle is prone to devastating flood, which is quite evident from the last past history. The major rivers that flows in and around Lanka Revenue Circle are; Kapili river, Dimaru river, khring Khring River & Lumding river along with there several tributaries. The circle comprises of 162 villages including 11 nos of Non Cadastral villages. There are 28 Nos of flood affected villages in Lanka Rev. Circle. Out of these villages there are 11 Nos are highly flood affected, 9 Nos moderate flood affected and 8 nos are low flood affected villages. During flood revenue villages remains submerged by flood water and the measures were adopted in due course to shift and shelter the affected families in different relief camps situated in comparatively high land areas, schools and embankment etc. and gratuitous reliefs were also distributed among the flood affected people residing in the camps at the evoke of such crucial situations. In addition, measures were also taken for sanitary facilities, safe drinking water and disinfectant packets were also distributed to keep the surrounding environment safe and clean. It is estimated that approximately 49,488 population are vulnerable to probable flood. To combat with such situation and for smooth conduct of relief and rescue in Lanka Revenue

Circle, a Circle Level Committee is proposed to be formed comprising of the Circle Officer, Lanka as Chairman and the local head of the Govt. Officers of various Depts., representatives of Panchayat and Zila Parisha, leading citizens of Lanka Revenue Circle as members.

The flood prone areas have been identified from previous records and these areas have been divided in 2 sectors namely Lanka Mouza and Kaki Mouza. This two sectors has covered by Zone 1 and the in-charge of this Zone is Circle Officer and Circle Officer (A). Each sector will be headed by a responsible senior Govt. officer of Lanka Revenue Circle. He will be responsible for smooth and effective management of flood relief and rescue operations. He/ she will keep close liaison with the Circle Officer as well as with the Circle Level Disaster Management Committee adequate measures according to the need of the situation. All the Gaonburha and VDP members are also member of this committee and they shall render all possible help to the committee as per demand of the hour.

CONTINGENCY PLAN OF LINE DEPARTMENTS:

I. P.W.D. Hojai Building Sub-Division:

<u>Introduction</u>: The state of Assam has been facing the natural calamities like flood annually during Monsoon season displacing millions of people from their homes and damaging crops, properties and cattles. Thousands of people also loss their lives during the flood. Hojai District is also a flood prone District of Assam and suffers innumerable losses during flood. PWD building has also some roles and responsibilities in helping the affected people and thus this flood contingency plan has been prepared to reduce miseries of people during flood.

Pre flood: Identification of high land and estimation of people affected living in low lying area. To give temporary shelter to flood affected people of Hojai District, it is necessary to identify high land like embankment and surface road and others structures of high land. For this a survey has to be conducted along with estimation of probable affected people.

During Flood: Construction of relief camps.

To provide shelter to affected people, it is necessary to construct relief camps on the high land of the District with bamboos and CGI sheets and tarpaulins. It may be estimated that around 500 (Five Hundred) families will be displaced from their homes with average 5 (Five) members in each family with an average cost of Rs. 4,000.00 (Rupees Four thousands) per family.

Post Flood: Thousands of houses will be washed away comprising huts, A/T houses etc. Hence, cost of these should be estimated.

Being an executing agency PWD Building Hojai has no monetary resources of its own and hence, the Govt. should provide the above amount to this department to assist the affected people as per this flood contingency plan for the current year. It may be mentioned here that the departmental Buildings of PWD Building Hojai have no Previous report of damages due to flood and hence cost of the same may be treated as nil.



Floods are the most common and wide spread of all natural disasters and Assam is one of the highly flood prone state in India. Every year, flood has caused damage to thousands of houses, public utilities, properties, loss of lives and displacement of people affected by the floods especially living in law land areas. Although, it is not possible to control the flood disaster totally, by adopting suitable structural and non structural measures the flood damages can be minimized. Here are some basic steps to take to prepare for the flood.

- 1. Identify potential that hazards and know how to secure or protect children before the floods strikes.
- 2. Be preparing to turn off electrical power when standing water, fallen power lines e.t.c.
- 3. Turn of Gas and Water supplies before evacuation.
- 4. First-Aid kit and manual should be kept in schools.

- 5. Evacuate the children and keep them under safe roof.
- 6. Rice, vegetables, kitchen accessories, cooking utensil, and firewood should be kept in a safe place to provide meal in case of emergency.
- 7. Not to let go off children until the flood recede.

Under Lanka Education Laskar Pathar, Kharikhana, Formarper, Kapiliper, are the most flood prone areas. During floods nearby schools which are not affected by the floods are invariably ready to provide shelter to all flood affected peoples.

All staff of BEEO & BMC Lanka is ready to remain present in the head quarter and will ready for pre-emergency and post disaster.

Head Teachers will ready the school building, toilet, drinking water etc for immediate shelter during disaster. They will inform the CRCC/BLOCK ACCOUNTANT/SIS/MIS CO-ORDINATOR/BEEO immediately whoever is reachable.

All staff will work as a team for disaster as first priority.

Under Jugijan Education Block Kandulimari, Barafuti, Jamunamukh (Partially), Nagayapam, Borhola, Charlock and Komorakata are the most flood prone areas. During floods all the staff of BEEO, Jugijan will remain in HQ and will ready for pre and post disaster. They will inform the CRCC/BLOCK ACCOUNTANT/SIS/MIS CO-ORDINATOR/BEEO immediately and all staff will work as a team for disaster as first priority.

IV. IRRIGATION DEPARTMENT (JAMUNA CAD DIVISION):

The JAMUNA Irrigation Scheme, named after its source Jamuna river is one of the successful major flow Irrigation scheme in Assam. It is also the first major Irrigation scheme completed in the year 1968-69 at the cost of Rs. 4343.00 crores and commissioned in june 1969. It covers a gross command area (G.C.A) of 33478.00 Ha and culturabe command area (C.C.A) of 27705.00 Ha in Karbi Anglong and Nagaon District. The command area lies between longitude 25.45' N and 26.4' N and latitudes 92.48' E and 93.15'E. The project is designed to tap Jamuna river near Bakuliaghat of Karbi Anglong district by constructing a diversion weir at Jamuna river and extending canal system on the left bank of the river to cover the command area bounded by the same on the north, bhalukmari puruna kaki Bakalia Road and part of railway line on the south and then extending in western direction beyond Doboka, Nilbagan Hojai Road. The water headed up the weir is carried to the paddy field through Main canal of length 4.24 KM which is further distributed in two direction with the help of three distributaries namely D-1 (25.777 KM), D-2 (23.378) and D-3 (41.544 KM). The whole canal system cover of length of 413.03 KM including Minors and sub-Minors to these three Distributories. It may be mentioned here that the irrigation water supplied by the scheme as this part of Nagaon district lies in rain shadow area.

LAST FLOOD EXPERIENCE:-

During the last year flood, several breaches have been occurred in the canal system and reported to the authority through proper channel. Moreover, in the interest of supplying water to the paddy field these breaches have been already closed but no fund has been alloted for the purpose yet.

The main reason of flood in the command area of jamuna Irrigation Scheme is of heavy unprecedented rainfall occurs in Karbi anglong Hills and in the Hilly areas of Lumding, then flash flood occurs in the catchment area due to split over water of Dimoru, Khring Khring, Kakijan and Dimorija, there is a misconception among the public that the canal system of Jamuna Irrigation Scheme is a reason for flood in same locality, But, the fact is that during flood season the regulator gates are always kept closed. The inlets of the canal system carries the excess water from the field to the canal system and on the other hand in some location the canal water is released through outlet structure. This is cross circulation of flood water only.

At present the following breaches are in deplorable condition of canal cum flood embankment:

- 1) Erosion Protection work from Jamuna River at Ch-2025.00 m to Ch-2275.00 m of C.C.F.E. at Dakhin Debasthan.
- 2) Erosion protection work from Ch-21880.00 M to Ch-21900.00 M at D-3 canal Jurapukhri.
- 3) Overtoping & Damage of canal embankment at Ch-9250.00M to Ch-9330.00 M canal-D3 kaki, Shoni Bazer.
- 4) Flood may damage Kalamonijan Scheme point No. 1 and 2 as severe erosion in the embankment resulting damage to Control Room and tilting of D.I pipe line
- 5)Pubjugijan is a flood prone area, every year flood effect the scheme Dimoru F.I.S resulting

to erosion of Earth filling in guide bunds.

- 6) In Nabhanga and Shibpur Scheme last year flood damage a lot to the canal system, again flood may damage to the canal system.
- 7) Hayang Pt. 1 and 2, Waregading Pt. 1 and 2 and Rajbari LIS are flood affected area. Last year flood damaged to the canal system a lot in the above schemes. this year also flood may affect the canal system.

This division has taken-up the following measures as precaution:-

- 1) All field officers and staff have been already cautioned for constant stay at the headquarter, to clear all cross regulatory structures, regulator gates, culverts, cross drainages, inlets, outlets from aquatic weeds and debriefs etc.
- 2) The Asst. Executive Engineer, Bakalia will inform the water level of Jamuna river recorded at 8 A.M everyday on the Gauge reading stationed to be installed by the water Resourse Department to the District Administration daily, during flood period. Similarly, the Asst. Executive Engineer, Nilbagan will inform the water level of Jamuna river under his jurisdiction.
- 3) The Asst. Executive Engineer, Bakalia will ensure that during the flood period the irrigation system will be closed.
- 4) The Asst. Executive Engineer (Nilbagan) will ensure constant vigilance of staff over canal cum flood embankment.
- 5) The Asst. Executive Engineer (Hojai) will ensure the safety of barges situated at different intake point of Kapili River.
- 6) A model estimate has been prepared for temporary restoration work for urgent work as and when felt necessary. (copy enclosed)

Primary Disaster Management responsibilities:

- Coordinate local resources and use of equipment
- Liaison with relevant emergency services
- Provide communication facilities
- Advise residents of flood prone areas to obtain sandbags
- Advise on weather, water flow, warnings and evacuation
- Issuing warning messages to local authorities
- A single point of contact for information
- Issue media statements
- Issue situation updates

ADVICE FOR PUBLIC:

- FLOOD WARNING: 'GO IN, STAY IN, TUNE IN'
- Stay calm
- Ensure that neighbours know of the warning, and be prepared to help them
- Keep a list of useful telephone numbers
- Monitor local radio
- Make a flood kit: medications, warm clothing, sealed food, blankets, matches, candles, flashlights, portable radio, spare batteries, rubber gloves, personal Documents

PERSONAL FLOOD PLANS:

- Discuss a plan with family members, friends and neighbours
- Know how to disconnect gas, electricity and water supplies
- Know where to move vehicles in an emergency.
- Store valuable property in a raised secure location
- Fill containers with clean water (Avoid using flood waters or local water)
- Care for the needs of pets and domestic animals

.IF FLOODING IS IMMINENT:

- Turn off electricity, gas and other connection.
- Move family members, pets and supplies upstairs

.SANDBAGS:

- Fill sandbags not more that ¾ full
- Lay them in layers with each row tight to each other, end to end
- Stamp them down before laying another row on top
- If a wall is more than two sandbags high, place a double line of bottom sandbags, followed by a second double line, then a single line on top.
- Make sandbags with compost bags, carrier bags or pillowcases filled with sand or earth
- Put a plastic sheet down first to act as an extra seal

- Protect all water entry points including air bricks, air vents and utility openings
- If gas vents are sealed, disconnect any gas supply Seals around doors and windows should be made watertight.
- It can take 60 sandbags to correctly seal an external door

GENERAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

- Do not walk, drive or swim through floods
- Be aware of hidden dips in a road
- Floods often contain sewage avoid food that may have been contaminated by floodwater
- Avoid wet electrical equipment
- Ventilate your property as much as possible, while maintaining security If evacuation is necessary follow police advice.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

When a flood warning message is received, the District Disaster Management Authority will alert relevant agencies/departments. Depending upon the scale of potential flooding may possibly occur, the main difficulties are:

- Care of evacuated, hurt or homeless people
- Protecting of utilities
- Availability of transport
- Flood alleviation e.g. clearing blocked culverts and drains
- Providing emergency health advice
- Providing road barriers and signs
- Coordinating emergency support

ROLE OF FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES HOJAI:-

Primary fire& Emergency service responsibilities:

- Rescue trapped casualties
- Control fires, released chemicals and other hazards
- Assess hazards concerning evacuation
- Ensure safety of rescue personnel
- Minimize environmental dangers
- Recover dead in conjunction with the police
- Stand by during recovery Deploy sandbags for flood defense.

Flood Preparedness Plan for Department of Fisheries in Hojai district.

Background:

VI.

Flood is a perennial problem affecting people in many parts of Hojai district every year. It causes severe damage to property and life of the mass. Multi-dimensional attention through interdepartmental services need to be addressed in order to fight against this natural calamity to minimize lose and restore damages in the district as well as in the state. The vulnerable area of the Hojai districts are Dholpukhuri Dev. Block, Jugijan Dev. Block and some parts of Binnakandi Dev. Block.

The department of Fisheries, Hojai has prepared an action plan considering overall scenario of Fisheries sector in Hojai district.

Issues and Challenges in discharging the responsibilities

- Inability to reach the affected areas due to severity of flood.
- Unable to contact with the farmers during to flood due to poor communication system in the remote villages.
- Inadequate funds to undertake operation during flood.
- Unavailability of immediate funds to keep stock of emergency inputs supplies such as lime, feed etc to distribute to the affected farmers.

Possible solutions

- Proper communication system will help to reach the affected farmers in the remote areas.
- Availability of emergency funds will help to undertake operation in the extreme situation.
- Farmers and fisher population consciousness about the insurance will help to regain the loss.
- Farmers' willingness and eagerness to visit the department will help to establish strong bond in near future.

Support required

• Requires emergency relief funds for the fishermen community affected during flood from SDRF

Role of the Department

Pre-Flood: The District Fishery Officer shall-

- Create awareness among the fish farmers and fisher populations in various Block /Panchayat Level about the impending flood.
- Prepare a roadmap of various flood prone areas to ease in survey.
- Acknowledge the fish farmers/fishers population to undertake Fishery Insurance.
- Undertake assessment of total fish farmers and fisher population that can possibly be affected by flood.
- Shall constitute a team of official to entrust them during flood for survey.
- Knowledge based training programme shall be conducted at various flood prone areas to how and what precautions shall be taken during flood.

- Arrangement of necessary stocks such as lime, feeds, seeds, manures, prophylactic treatment materials etc.
- Ensure the fish farmers to create flood resilient bunds/embankments to protect the ponds from flood.

During Flood: On receipt of flood warning, the District Fishery Dev. Officer:

- Shall alert the official team for precaution and necessary action.
- Check stock of seeds, feeds, manures and make arrangements for raising seeds.
- Shall immediately collect data of fish farmers and fisher populations that are affected by flood.
- Suggest them for necessary arrangement to protect the fish from escaping.
- Shall make arrangement for relief distributions to the affected fish farmers and fisher populations as guided by district administration.
- Render technical guidance and arrangement for prophylactic treatment measures of ponds/tanks that are exposed to flood water to prevent from outbreak of disease.

Post Flood: In post flood period, the District Fishery Dev. Officer shall:

- Help in physical restoration of damaged ponds/tanks as per fund availability.
- Supply required and necessary inputs materials to revive their damaged ponds/tanks as per fund availability.
- Suggest the fish farmers for partial harvesting of the marketable size fishes to prevent loss due to possible disease outbreak if any.
- Make necessary arrangement for testing of ponds/tanks exposed to flood water to assess the water quality.

Hojai (PHE) Division is situated in Hojai District of Assam. A part of this Division is a flood prone area. The most vulnerable area is within the jurisdiction of Binnakandi Block, Jugijan Block & apart of Dhalpukhuri Dev. Block. The Hojai (PHE) Division covers the following Development Blocks of the Hojai District.

- 1. Binnakandi Development Block
- 2. Jugijan Development Block
- 3. Dhalpukhuri Development Block
- 4. Udali Development Block
- 5. Lumding Development Block

Besides this there are 67 Nos. of G.P., 403 Nos. Villagers and 1888 Habitations under this Division. During most of the Floods in preceding years it was experienced that the extent of damage was substantive. As such advance planning based on previous experience is utmost essential to combat flood and restrict to minimum damage for which the entire area of the Division has been divided into two Zones and a number of sectors for easily trace out the duties of officer, so that no flood affected area left out or unattended during the time of emergency situation of flood. The (PHE) Sub-Divisional officer is addressed here as a Zonal officer and the area under his control is Zonal area. Similarly, the Sectional Officer incharge of the Section is addressed here as a sector officer and the area under their control is denoted here as a sectoral area. The name of Zone and sectors and officer incharge entrusted in the flood duties with their name, designation and contract mobile No. are shown below:-

ASSISTANCE TO RELIEF CAMP:

Regarding Relief Camp, concerning Zonal Officer is to keep constant touch with the Circle Officer/Civil Administration.

The concerned Sector officer will pay frequent visit to the relief Camp setup by the Civil Administration and intimate the concerning Asstt. Executive Engineer (PHE)/Zonal Officer, regarding the flood situation in details and will remain in constant touch with the officer incharge of the said relief camp. Whatever may be the water supply arrangement, distribution of water purifying packets is to be sustained for the said relief camp. They should do it in consultation with the officer incharge accordingly and to keep a proper record from the account point of view, so that no complicacy may arise.

The Asstt. Executive Engineer (PHE) concerned will intimate the details of flood situation to the undersigned time to time action taken by the field staff to overcome the flood situation by way of restoration works after water supply infrastructures, distribution of chemicals packets etc. on and

the unavoidable expenditures incurred in such situation will be reported to the concerned Civil authority for follow up action in due coarse

To ensure sustainable performance of water supply schemes during flood situation vital components such as clear water pump set at TP site, steel floating Barge at Intake point with Raw water pump set etc. will require extra attention & for that staffs of the concerning schemes should be required to access the status of the components besides duty of proper chlorination of the water at T.P. site.

After receding the flood all staffs related to the schemes will be engaged in cleaning the site with follow up action of disinfection so that the beneficiaries will get the safe water. The concerned site incharge will be responsible for engagement of field staffs for flood relief works and they will not be allowed to leave the H.Q. without prior permission from the concerned Asstt Executive Engineer (PHE).

To maintain the flood works, the Asstt. Executive Engineer concern may issue schedule of work calendar to the concerning S.O. during flood time and verify the same as per flood situation, if situation so demands.

MATERIALS

As on today (07.04.2021) PHE, Hojai Division has a stock of Lime =0.5 M.T., Alum=3.00 M.T. and Bleaching powder = 1.50 M.T. of each bag 25 Kg. weight and daily issuing these chemical from this stock for O.M. of all PWSS under Hojai PHE Division. We have send the requirement of materials and Chemicals to the Chief Engineer (PHE), Water, Assam, Hengrabari, Guwahati-36 as flood preparedness.

Installation of Ordinary H.P if required during the flood time at any relief camp, will be done with due approval from the Hojai District Administration & subject to the availability of stock and necessary permission from the office of the C.P.H.E., Hengrabari. As regards to the distribution of water purifying Chemical Packets, the distribution chart with receivers signature must be kept as a flood relief work document, which is to be submitted to the office of the undersigned to keep the proper record.

As soon as the flood relief works get started and materials are supposed to be utilized for the said work the separate account on the head of -Flood Relief work for 2021-22| is to be maintained showing the APWD account manual.

In the mean time the A.E.E. (PHE), Hojai Sub-Division is requested to prepare at least 5000 Nos. water purifying chemicals packets of 100gm. Weightage to keep the ready stock on emergent basis.

The Chemical packets will be distributed among the flood affected people through different agencies:-

1. **CIVIL AUTHORITIES**:

The relief Branch of the D.C. Office, SDC's office etc. normally distribute materials like Rice, Dal, Salts etc. So the PHE officers in connection with the officials of the Civil authority may hand over some water purifying chemical packets for distribution among the flood affected people. For this act. PHE department should maintain constant touch with the control room to the Civil authorities and the relief branch to maintain proper distribution and assessment of area wise requirement of such water purifying packets. Besides this, the field officer should visit the affected area and camps to ensure proper use of water purifying chemical packets and its effects on health may be carried out. In other way, people will be motivated to adopt the practice.

2. **MEDICAL DEPARTMENT**:-

Medical Team constantly move in the flood effected area and camps during flood period. Their help in distribution and assessment of requirement of water purifying chemical packets may be very useful.

3. **VOLUNTARY ORGANISATION (NGO)**:-

It is experienced that regarding distribution of water purifying packets would have been very effective if these packets are delivered through them. So action may be taken accordingly to rope in local NGO.

4. **GAON PANCHAYAT**:-

The water purifying chemical packets may also be distributed through GP Level as deem fit.

ACTIVITIES OF FIELD STAFFS OF PHE DEPARTMENT :-

Local field functionaries who are generally entrusted with the job for smooth maintenance of water sources shall perform most vital role:-

- i) Distribution of water purifying chemical packets along with leaf lets among flood affected people.
- ii) Undertake disinfection of water sources including spot sources, community pond etc. as post flood measure to avoid out-break of water borne disease.
- iii) From the past experience it is observed that some people of flood affected areas take shelter with their domestic animal etc. on the E & D Embankment. As a result, these areas become badly polluted. So, these areas need to be disinfected regularly with lime & bleaching powder.

All such staffs must have knowledge regarding fall-out of contaminated water, procedure for use of chemical packets. It is their responsibility to put-up a demonstration before flood affected people highlighting potential treat out of flood water and preparation of safe water by using chemical packets.

Once the flood water is receded, the most important task is to undertake thorough disinfection of all affected water sources. In this exercise, the field level staffs play a crucial role. No such source shall be allowed to be used by the public until & unless proper disinfection is carried out.

For effective disinfections, all water resources shall be kept with bleaching powder solutions for overnight and on next day water shall be pumped out till chlorine content is less an 0.20mg/L At that point of time people may be allowed to withdraw water from the disinfected source.

It may also be very much useful to conduct awareness programme at the relief camps/flood affected area with special emphasis on water borne diseases caused by contaminated water and how to have safe water from flood affected sources by means of water purifying chemicals.

Past experience shows that, safe water become one of the most scarce item during flood time. Since nothing can survive without water, all out efforts need to be made to ensure availability of safe water and Public Health Engineering Department will do its best in this regards in co-ordination with other Departments.

Medicines are supplied routinely from DMS, Hojai and special demand will be placed for emergency medical relief.

AMBULANCE FACILITY:

There is Two No. of Ambulance available at Jugijan BPHC . One is under Jugijan CHC and another is under Hojai FRU/CHC

STRUCTURE & JOB ASSIGNMENT:

Control Room: - For convenient management of any emergency and other epidemic during and after any natural disaster one control room is established at Jugijan BPHC with phone no: 9365828505 under the arrangement and supervision of **Dr. R.C Bordoloi** ,SDM&HO,Jugijan BPHC. He will prepare the duty roster for control room and maintain a register for record of information received and action taken there upon.

MOBILE MEDICAL TEAM:

One mobile medical team with M.O and other medical staff will keep ready for any medical emergency.

INSTRUCTION TO STAFF:

All the ANM's are instructed to follow the following orders:-

- 1. To arrange public meeting in their respective flood prone areas and to provide health education on various communicable diseases. Pure drinking water, environmental sanitation and hygiene.
- 2. To collect B/S of every fever case and submit the same at Jugijan BPHC and Hojai FRU daily for prompt action and fruitful treatment.
- 3. To submit daily disease surveillance report of their area to the undersigned.
- 4. To keep contact with the undersigned and the Supervisor for any needful action against any emergency.
- 5. To stay at their respective headquarters and not to take any leave (except medical ground) without prior permission from the authority during and after flood.

All ASHA's are instructed to gear up home visit and provide health education on Diarrhea, Malaria, Sanitation, Hygiene etc. They are also instructed to take B/S of every fever case and the MPW/SW and ASHA Supervisor are suggested to supervise the activities of field workers and to submit daily report to the undersigned.

The Joint Director of Health Services, Hojai is requested to supply adequate emergency medicines and disinfectant for disaster of any kind.

The Joint Director of Health Services, Hojai is requested to supply sufficient quantity of anti-malaria drugs, micro-slides and other necessary articles required during and after flood. Weekly meeting of medical staff including MO will be convened to review day to day situation as a precautionary measure. All field staff including ANM's are informed that any short fall or negligence in their duty will be brought to the notice of higher authority for responsible for any incident.

The undersigned will always be ready for overall management and supervision to cope with any emergent action. He will keep regular contact with the liaison officers related to disaster management for any co-operation.

- 6. To arrange public meeting in their respective flood prone areas and to provide health education on various communicable diseases. Pure drinking water, environmental sanitation and hygiene.
- 7. To collect B/S of every fever case and submit the same at Doboka CHC daily for prompt action and fruitful treatment.
- 8. To submit daily disease surveillance report of their area to the undersigned.
- 9. To keep contact with the undersigned and the Supervisor for any needful action against any emergency.
- 10. To stay at their respective headquarters and not to take any leave (except medical ground) without prior permission from the authority during and after flood.

All ASHA's are instructed to gear up home visit and provide health education on Diarrhea, Malaria, Sanitation, Hygiene etc. They are also instructed to take B/S of every fever case and the MPW/SW and ASHA Supervisor are suggested to supervise the activities of field workers and to submit daily report to the undersigned.

The Joint Director of Health Services, Nagaon is requested to supply adequate emergency medicines and disinfectant for disaster of any kind.

The SDM & HO In-Charge Kothiatoli BPHC is requested to supply sufficient quantity of anti-malaria drugs, micro-slides and other necessary articles required during and after flood. Weekly meeting of medical staff including MO will be convened to review day to day situation as a precautionary measure. All field staff including ANM's are informed that any short fall or negligence in their duty will be brought to the notice of higher authority for responsible for any incident.

The undersigned will always be ready for overall management and supervision to cope with any emergent action. He will keep regular contact with the liaison officers related to disaster management for any co-operation.

SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT

Introduction

Disaster is an incident/event that comes unexpected and the main responsibility of district administration then becomes the proper management of resources, be it material, physical or manpower. As per the DDMA directions, in the state, every department must have a Departmental Disaster Management Plan. Accordingly, a detailed Departmental Disaster Management Plan has been prepared for the Social Welfare Department, Nagaon District as well. While preparing this document, an effort has been made to:-

- Identify probable disaster area under each ICDS Project and nodal officer for each such situation may be deputed. Therefore the respective duties of all the members of Departmental Disaster Management committee should be clearly defined.
- Plan a detailed individual Departmental Disaster management Plan for handling important disaster situation.

Profile of the Department

The role and responsibilities are destined to witness a phenomenal expansion in the coming years due to the heightened social awareness of the problems faced by the children, women and physically challenged persons, recognition of their genuine needs at both national and international levels and commitment of both the central and state governments to ensure inclusive growth.

Organizational structure:

- **a.** Administrative department: The Secretary, Social Welfare Department, Assam is the administrative head at the state level.
- **b.** Directorate: Director of Social Welfare, Assam functions as the head of department and control over all districts.
- **c.** Other sub-ordinate offices: 1. The Programme Officer in the Division.
 - 2. The District Social Welfare Officer as district head.
 - 3. The Superintendent of State Homes and Juvenile Justice Act.
 - 4. At Block level The Child Development Project officer of ICDS

Schemes and Services: 1. Integrated Child Development Service:

a) **Kishori Shakti Yojana**: Earlier known as National Programme for Adolescent Girl (NPAG), is a scheme for improve the nutritional, health and development status of adolescent girls, promote awareness of health, hygiene, nutrition and family care, link them to opportunities for learning life skills, going back to schools, help them gain a better understanding of their Social Environment and take initiatives to become productive members of the society.

- **b) Supplementary Nutrition Programme:** The ICDS Programme aims at enhancing nutritional and health status of children under 6 years of age, pregnant women, lactating mothers and of late adolescent girls.
- c) Immunization: Immunization programme is for immunize all the children to prevent any epidemic disease.
- d) Health checkups and referral services.
- e) **Nutrition and Health Education:** The main object of this scheme is to form capacity building of women especially in the age group of 15 to 45 years. So that they can look after their own health, nutrition and development needs as well as that of their children and families.
- f) Non formal preschool education: Since in India 48% of the population live below the poverty line, 63.83% are illiterate and one fifth of the population is the age group 0-6 yrs hardly needs any emphasis. So that this scheme is specially for the children in the age group of 0-6 yrs for their all round development.
- g) Early detection of childhood disability.
- **2** Mukhya Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana: The objective of the scheme is providing partial compensation for the wage loss in term of cash incentives so that women can take adequate rest before and after delivery of the first living child. The cash incentive provided would lead to improved health seeking behaviours amongst the pregnant women and Lactating Mothers(PW&LM).
- **3 Mukhya Mantri Mahila Samridhi Yojana :** This scheme is for economically help the women weavers of the state of Assam.
- **4 Implementation of persons with Disability:** This Scheme provide special education facilities to the Deaf and Dum children, to the Blind children and also to the mentally retarded children. The Blind schools are run by NGO's such as Sreemanta Sankar Mission Blind School, Nagaon. This scheme also provide scholarship/stipend facilities to the physically challenge students.
- 1. **Sawayamsidha**: The Sawayamsidha is an integrated scheme for Women's empowerment. The programme is based on the formation of women Self Help Groups (SHG) and enable the SHG's take up schemes and programmes social and economic empowerment of women.
- 2. **POSHAN ABHIYAAN(NATION NUTRION MISSION): The POSHAN Abhiyaan is the Prime Minister's overarching** scheme for holistic nutrition or National nutrition mission, is Government of India's Flag ship programme to improve nutritional outcomes for children, pregnant women and lactating mothers. Intensified health and nutrition services for the first 1000 days.

<u>Infrastructure available with the Social Welfare department, Nagaon</u>: The District has 6129 sanctioned AWC's and Mini AWC's in rural, tribal and urban areas spread across the total operational projects in the District.

Social welfare Department had sanctioned Rs. 3,500,000 Lakh for construction of new AWC buildings. The other infrastructure facilities are 04 AWW training centres, 01 State Homes and 01 Old age homes.

Hazards and Vulnerability Scenario

2.1 Prevalent hazards in the State (Natural & Manmade):

The tributaries of the Brahmaputra have widely divergent characteristics in the District. 45% of Assam's total area is flood prone. The Brahmaputra river with its 34 tributaries causes regular floods in the state. The average annual rainfall in the state is 1662.2 mm. 90% of the heavy downpour occurs in the month of April-September. During 2003, 30 people have lost their lives, 4660 houses have been damaged and 0.2 million hectares cropped area has been affected.

Floods in Nagaon: In the year 2004 three devastating waves of flood occurred and created havoc among the vulnerable population of the district. In the year, flood waters of Kopili inundated many areas in Kampur, Raha and Hojai circles. Jamuna river also inundated areas in Doboka circle of Nagaon district disrupting road communication between Doboka and Diphu. On 8-10-04, National Highway was overtopped at Nellie. However one RCC bridge was badly affected on 10-10-04 morning after which vehicular traffic between Guwahati and Upper Assam was totally disrupted. In Nagaon district, road communication has been disrupted at Kampur-Baithalangshu, Kampur-Bakulguri, Kampur-Kathiatoli as the NH-37 damage at Raha due to RCC bridge collapse. In the district about 5 lakh people have been affected by the flood in the year 2004.

Cyclonic Storm: Occasional cyclones do occur in the district particularly in May to July by the southwest monsoon, their severity is more during this period. At times these cyclones are devastating bringing colossal loss of human lives and damage to properties. Recent storm was occurred in the year 2004 with huge damage in the district.

Earthquakes: The frequent occurrence of earthquakes in Assam is related to the geology of the region. Earthquakes occur in those regions where the crust is markedly unstable, such as mountain belts of geologically recent origin. One such region is formed by the Himalayan Mountains and the Nagaland and Mizoram around the northern, the north-eastern and the eastern border of the stable peninsular wedge of the Assam plateau.

Like the rest of Assam the Nagaon district has always been subject to earthquakes as it lies in the zone of seismic disturbances. The great earthquake which occurred on June 12, 1897 had its epicentre in the Shillong plateau. It had a magnitude of 8.5 Richter and was probably one of the greatest earthquakes ever recorded. In Nagaon most of the government buildings including the circuit house, court building and D.C bungalow were rendered unfit for habitation. Part of the District Jail wall collapsed and the metal road along the side of the Kolong was split up with yawning fissures. The earthquake of August 15, 1950 had its epicentre at 28.50 N and 96.70 E and had a magnitude of 8.6 Richter. The estimated area of northeastern Assam over which extensive and heavy damaged occurred was 1,900 Km2.

Urban Flooding: Towns have grown faster on account of increase of population. Owing to lack of control, there has been considerable encroachment of flood plains. Damages become serious as a result of inadequate capacity of storm water draining system. The problem of urban flooding has become serious. Nagaon regularly experiences urban flooding which causes disruption of normal life every year.

Water-logging: The plain areas of the district suffer from the inundation caused by spilling of the river Brahmaputra and its tributaries. In some areas of Nagaon this is an annual phenomenon and the water logging continues for many months each year.

River Erosion: The erosion of the banks by the rivers and the consequent loss of life and property are major problems. Rivers tend to erode their beds and banks in the hilly regions resulting in the deepening and widening of rivers. Large scale slumping of river banks takes place when the level falls after a flood. Erosion, therefore, has become a serious problem in Bhurbandha, Rupahihat, Lawkhowa, and Dhing area of the district as it eroded the valuable land.

Drought: Drought was once experience by the district in the year 2009 and the farmers had to bear heavy loss. The production was very low and the district administration had to distribute relief materials and seed to the affected population. The whole district is vulnerable to drought.

Other manmade disasters: The district has no recent history of any manmade disaster viz. Ethnic clashes, riots, bomb blast etc. But being the centre place of Assam and surrounded by hills, Nagaon district is always vulnerable towards terrorist activities.

It falls under Nagaon Road Circle, Nagaon and PWD, Tezpur Zone, Tezpur. The Circle is headed by The Superintending Engineer and Addl. Chief Engineer is the administrator of the Zone.

Rural Population Composition:-

As per 2011 Census, total population of Hojai is 9,31,218 nos.

Geology and Geomorphology:-

The soil condition of Hojai district is Metamorthic one . It is made of partly sedimentary and alluvial deposits . The sediments are mostly shale , sandstone , lime stone and conglomerate.

Physical features:-

The entire district is situated at the bank of Kapili and Jamuna River.

Climate and rainfall:-

The climate in Hojai District is warm and average temperature is 24.4° c. In winter there is much less rainfall in Hojai then in summer. Average annual precipitation is about 1562 mm. June, July and August are the hottest and December and January is the coolest month.

Socio - Economic Features :-

Hojai pre-eminently Agriculture belt and in recent time it has attracted attention owing to each fabulously Agaru and Agaru product export to outside country specially Gulf Country. Hojai offers a mosaic of ethnic linguistic and religious community.

Objectives of Departmental Disaster Management Plan:-

The objectives behind the preparation of the Departmental Disaster management plan by the Executive Engineer, PWD, Hojai District Territorial Road Division, .is:

- To mitigate impact of natural and manmade disasters through preparedness at the District , Block , Gram Panchayat and village level too.
- To provide effective support and resources to all the concerned individuals, groups and departments in disasters.
- To disseminate factual information in a timely, accurate and tactful manner while maintaining necessary confidentiality.
- To develop immediate and long-term support plans for vulnerable roads and cross drainage works in/during disasters .
- To have response system in place to face any eventuality related to disruption of road communication.

- To ensure active participation by the Government administration, communities, NGOs, CBOs and volunteers at all levels making optional utilization of human and material resources of Rural Roads at the time of disasters.
- To equip the people with the knowledge and skills for assessing delineating, strategies and delivering their roles in relation to risk mitigation, prevention and implementation of effective response of Rural Roads to the extreme events.
- To enable understanding on the integration of Climatic Change Adaptation (CCA), Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and sustainable developments and their associated impacts and challenges on roads and cross drainage works.
- To equip with knowledge and skills on understanding and analyzing pathways, Approaches
 and process of linking CCA and DRR concerns into development planning in response to
 road networks.

To ensure that , standard code of practices such as Indian Road Congress (IRC) publications , Ministry of Surface Road Transport (MoST) , Bureau of Indian Standard (BIS) Code , Seismic codes etc. are followed by the department for design and construction of road works to minimizing the effects of disasters

Main tasks of the Department and possibilities of integration of related disaster management aspects

Main tasks of the Department:

The primary responsibilities/activities of Hojai District Territorial Road Division is maintenance and improvement of Rural Road (i.e. infrastructure of roads ,bridges, culverts and road furniture/road signs) that signifies as a key component of rural development by promoting access to economic and social service and thereby generating increased agriculture incomes and productive employment opportunities .

Some of the important tasks under this department are as follows:

i) PMGSY:

The Pradhan Mantri Gramin Sadak Yojana is a nationwide plan in India to provide good all weather road connectivity to unconnected habitations. It is under the authority of the Ministry of Rural Developed, Govt.of India and it was begun in 2000. The goal was to provide connectivity with all weather roads to all the villages with a population of 1000 persons and 500 persons.

At the district level, the programme is co-ordinated and implanted through Programme Implementation Unit (PIU). In Hojai District, it is carried out by P.W.D, Hojai District Territorial Road Division,.

Few works under this head are mentioned in Annx.(A)

ii) OTHER THAN PMGSY

Under Rural Infrastructure Development Fund other than PMGSY, different schemes are sanctioned for development of rural infrastructure, particularly rural roads and construction of R.C.C. Bridges

Few works under this head are mentioned Annx.(B)

v) INTREGRATION WITH WATER RESOURCE DEPARTMENT:

Prior to the finalization of Black Topped road level and Deck level of RCC Bridge, HFL (High Flood Level) data will be collected from concerned Water Resource Department of that area.

3.1.2. Possibilities of integration of related disaster management aspects

It is difficult to predict the accurate time, location, magnitude of any disasters. So, the departmental construction works should always be concerned with the disasters whether known or unknown or unforeseen. Hence, the construction of a road/cross drainage works should be plan/designed and construct it in conformity with the standard code of practices utilizing sound able materials. To maintain the quality of the construction works, the laboratory tests plays a vital role. The weak bridges should be strengthened by retrofitting, steel trusses, replacement of elastomeric bearings, alteration of wearing coat by mastic asphalt etc. All SPT bridges is also to be converted into RCC one. Introducing Interlocking Concrete Paver Block (ICPB) pavement gives a higher priority in this region over conventional bituminous roads as effective measures to climatic change scenario. Besides that, erection of road side drain also imparts fruitful results. The geometric design for the pavement such as design speed, ROW, Carriage width, vertical curves, horizontal curves, camber, super elevation etc. have been incorporated in road project as per standard guidelines.

All requisite road safety signs as per standard guidelines have been incorporated in proper places to minimize accidents and effective utilization of road networks. Some following road furniture should be included in a road project.

- Road marking
- Cautionary, Mandatory, Informatory signs
- Km stones and 200m stones
- Delineators and object markers
- Guard posts, crash barriers and speed breakers
- Rumble strip

A key road map of this district would be prepared by the Line departments which specify NH, state roads, block roads, village roads, railways, waterways, indices etc. as a ready reference with the help of District Administration.

Departmental capacity building policy for Disaster Management:

The Hojai District Territorial Road Division proposes the following for capacity building policy.

- The department will propose to the Government for procurement of modernized construction equipments such as vehicles viz. excavator, dumper, cranes, roller, truck, mixture machine, vibrators, laboratory testing equipments etc.
- There will be a sophisticated laboratory to carry out departmental works in good quality.
- Registration of sound contractors under this division who have ample construction materials, tools and equipments, vehicles and man power.
- Arrangement of training programs for the departmental staff, contractors, NGOs, civil citizens in regards of advance knowledge and skills with the experts. Besides that, some awareness programs will be also held.
- A rich training programs of some technical staff /register contractors with the other institutions will be proposed to the Government. These training programs will be held on Awareness of road safety, Procedure & testing of materials, Advance Technical know how about construction of roads to field staff, Climatic Change Adaptation & Disaster Risk Reduction in relation to Road works etc.
- Distribution of leaf lets, erection of hoarding / posturing about the road safety.
- Incorporation of reputed construction company in road works.

- Construction of road with Interlocking Concrete Paver Block (ICPB) pavement instead of traditional bituminous road surface.
- Construction of road side drain with the proposed and existing roads.
- Construction of road furniture/road signs effectively at each road.
- Incorporation of experts within the construction of new roads, repairing, strengthening and retrofitting works.
- Mock Drills

Gaps in the existing capacity:-

The road works are very complex and critical. But, the road division does not have sufficient capacity to carry out the road works . The department is dependent on the support of others such as contractors / suppliers, laboratory test etc. At present, there are no departmental vehicles such as roller, dumper, excavators, ladders, cranes, boats, modernized tools & equipment to fight with the disasters under this division. As a result, the man power and technical know how cannot be effectively utilized. Besides that, materials like cement, reinforcement, bitumen etc. are not available with the department . This has to be arranged by the contractors for respective works. Due to lack of fund under these department, the training programs could not arranged in time.

Review, Up gradation, Dissemination of DM Plan:-

DM plan is a -living document. Regular improvement and updating of the Departmental Disaster Management Plan will be done half yearly with incorporation of new suggestions and addition of improvement mechanisms.

However, an updated schedule of time framed is as here under.

The DM plan will be printed and circulated among all the officials of the department besides all the stakeholders of Disaster Management such as Departments, GOVT & NGOs, individuals, Panchayats.

System of updation of Departmental Disaster Plan:-

The Departmental DM plan will be updated by conducting a sharing cum review meeting every six months with all the staff of the department. Various suggestions from other department, individuals will also be included in the DM plan.

XIII. WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

PREPAREDNESS FOR PROBABLE FLOOD -2021 UNDER NAGAON WATER RESOURCES SUB-DIVISION, NAGAON.

- **1.** <u>Control Room</u>: The Departmental Control Room will be functioning in the office of the Executive Engineer, Nagaon W.R. Division with effect from 15th May 2018 to 15th Oct.-2018, round the clock. Flood messages will be transmitted everyday at 12 hours from the Control Room. Telephone No. of Control Room **03672231132**.
- **2 Field Staff**: Field staff are detailed in their respective sections/beats as shown in Annexure-I.
- **3 Flood Fighting Materials**: Flood fighting materials will be centrally stocked in the Divisional Store, Nagaon and shall be sent to the different sections/beats as per requirements.
- 4. Embankments and Vulnerable reaches :-

Kopilli Right Bank dyke from Kharikhana to Jugijan: - Falls under jurisdiction of Hojai district. Length-23km, Benefited area: - 24,847 ha. The dyke is prone to flood damages at several locations due to seepage, leakage, boiling, overtopping etc. during high flood periods.

The breaches (Two major breaches and ten breach like damages) that occurred during the flood of 2020 are yet to the closed/ repaired. Estimates for closing/repair of the breach were accorded Administrative Approval by the Revenue and Disaster Management Department. Tender for the said works were floated by the Chief Engineer Water Resources Department through the process of e-tendering. However, the work orders for the same were not yet issued by Chief Engineer Water Resources Department due to Model Code of Conduct and as such the breach closing/ repair works could not be taken up till date. If the same could not be taken up immediately, it is apprehended that the breach closing works cannot be completed before the onset of monsoon. The matter was already brought to the notice of Chief Engineer Water Resources Department vide this office letter No. C/310/10/2197 dated 18/3/2021.

Most vulnerable reach due to erosion:

1. At 16th km near Jamunasheet village in Hojai Revenue Circle.

Affected reach – about 600M,

Minimum offset of bank from dyke -20 m only.

2. At 6th km to 9th km Akantu area near Madrasa in Lanka Revenue Circle.

Affected reach - about 800M

Minimum offset from dyke -80 m only.

3. At 4th km to 6th km Thaisubali area in Lanka Revenue Circle.

Affected reach - about 1800M

Minimum offset from dyke – 120 m only.

Vulnerable reaches are shown in the Annexure- II furnished herewith.

- **5.** <u>Distances of vulnerable reaches from H.O</u>.:- Distances of vulnerable reaches are Shown in the Annexure -I furnished.
- 6. Remedial measures :-
 - (i) Breaches occurred in the flood of 2012 have been repaired.

- (ii) Breaches occurred in the flood of 2020 are yet to be repaired.
- (iii) Minor damages on the dykes are being repaired under flood drill provision (Minor repairing).
- (iV) Men with flood fighting materials shall be put in force on the dykes during high floods as per site exigency.

7. Flood Gauge Stations:-

- (i). At Silghat for river Brahmaputra. Danger level- 67.00m.
- (ii). At Kampur for river Kopilli. Danger level -60.50m.
- (iii). At Nagaon for river Kallong. Danger level-59.146m.

Temporary Gauge Station:-(IV). At Thaisubali for river Kopilli . Danger level- 71.00M. Water levels will be recorded during the flood period twice daily at 8 A.M. and 4 P.M. in the respective flood gauge stations and sent to the Divisional Control Room.

8 Rain Gauge Station: - At Water Resources Office compound. Rainfall is recorded once daily at 8 A.M. and sent to the Divisional Control Room.

2) Take up steps for implementation by the various authorities as per the recommendations of DDMA meeting on flood preparedness. By 30th April, the DC as Chairperson DDMA will: Divide the district into compact zones each comprising a group of villages falling under both _very vulnerable' and _vulnerable' areas as classified in DDMP and each such zone shall be serially numbered. Select responsible officers not below the rank of Circle Officer who have thorough idea of the geographical terrain and other local conditions of the respective zone, to be designated as Relief Officer (RO) for placing him in charge of each zone and shouldering such duties and responsibilities as may be assigned to him Select sites for evacuation centres and relief centres in safe areas.

The site for sheltering livestock may be decided in consultation with the district A. H. & Veterinary officer. In selecting sites, preference shall be given to high lands, schools, market places and places not likely to be inundated.

Make a rough estimate of requirements:

Controlled commodities like rice, atta, and controlled cloth and other non-controlled essential commodities like edible oil, salt, kerosene, free sugar, gur, pulses, potatoes, baby food, wheat bran and similar items and intimate the Deputy Director or any other officers of Civil Supplies in the district for necessary arrangement.

Petrol for vehicles requisitioned from the public; engine driven mar-boats, launches and arrange with depots or agencies of the IOC for ensuring supply as and when required during floods and intimate such arrangements to the district officers of the concerning departments.

Operational cost of the boats for carrying out Search & Rescue and evacuation operation may be incurred from the GR funds.

3) Prepare A sub-division wise list of officers and staff available for deployment of relief duty as and when called for; A list of jeeps, buses, trucks and other vehicles for requisition in case of necessity, in consultation with the D.T.O; A list of boats/mar-boats/bailey bridges as shall be

available from P.W.D. and the Inland Water Transport Department. A list of boats, private and public, other than those included in the list prepared under (iii) above, which can be requisitioned in case of necessity.

4) The Deputy Commissioner will undertake a joint inspection by the 10thof May along with the E.E., WR department and S.P., as a precautionary measure against breaches in embankments, bunds, drains, nullahs and other flood protection works, to see if necessary repairs and the like have been done and that they are in good condition.

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1) DDMA will conduct weekly meeting to review flood management during the flood season

2) On receipt of flood warning D.C will: Take action as per Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) prepared by the State Send relief officers along with other staff to the respective

zones; Request SP to send Police party and install temporary wireless stations if required Direct Station Officer, Fire & Emergency Services to place State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) personnel along with rescue boats if required. Seek suggestion from the WR department for evacuating people from vulnerable places

3) On occurrence of Flood the DC will: Visit the places of occurrence Ascertain the nature and extent of flood Make prompt operational decisions Assess requirement of men and materials for relief operations Call for coordinated aid Ensure that services are arranged and materials are mobilized according to the needs Supervise arrangement in Evacuation centres and Relief Camps Arrange to collect donation in cash and kind from local branches of Red Cross, UNICEF etc. & contribution from the Voluntary Organizations Requisition as and when necessary the services of the officers of various departments, Urban Local bodies and Zilla Parishads for undertaking relief works Call for Non-Officials/Volunteers/ of other voluntary organizations, if circumstances so warrant, to associate for such works as may be considered suitable for Secure assistance from the Army/NDRF or other Central

Government Response agencies when arrangement made by civil authorities prove to be inadequate D.C will make arrangements for constructing shelter in Relief Camps if required and will arrange in the Relief Camps sanitation and maintenance of clean lines and water supply through the P.H.E.DC will, within the scales prescribed by the State, grant gratuitous relief in cash and kind to the deserving affected people. Gratuitous relief will be distributed through responsible Government officers. Details of the GR issued are to be displayed in a notice board in the Relief Camp for public information and maintenance of transparency DC will arrange proper distribution of relief articles received as donation in kind among the deserving affected people through the official and non-official agencies DC will arrange for taking care of the infirm, destitute, orphans, children and expectant/nursing mothers in the relief centres through the assistance of the distribution social welfare officer Supply of cooked food should generally be discouraged.

DC will arrange supply of cooked food in evacuation centres / relief camps only in unavoidable cases. Where so supplied, the quantity should as far as possible be at the scales prescribed by the State

After Flood

- 1) DC will collect agricultural statistics from the revenue staff and the district agricultural officer about areas under crops actually affected by flood, damage to crops and the number of cultivators involved
 - 2) Immediately after the flood water recedes, a report on losses and damages of each district is to be submitted to the Government in the Revenue & Disaster Management Department.
- 3) Make:

Assessment of the requirement and arrangement for distribution through the Agriculture department:

- i) Seeds and seedlings as grants-in-aid and
- ii) Agricultural loans in cash and kind such as seeds, seedlings, manures, agricultural equipment

Grant rehabilitation loans for construction repairmen of houses in deserving cases among the affected people

4) Provide in case of persons who are uprooted by erosion, alternative lands for homestead or cultivation as the case may be and also arrange for distribution among them, if necessary, gricultural grant and loans. Endeavor should however, be made to provide alternative land near about their original villages.

Contraction & closure of relief:: While it is necessary to provide all kinds of relief required, it is equally essential that strict economy is exercised so that resources of the state do not get strained unduly. Generally, full pictures as to the duration of relief measures will emerge as soon as the waters have subsided. DC will judge for how long the relief operation is to be continued and when contraction/closures of operation is needed. In declaring closures of relief operation he will take the approval of the divisional commissioner and inform all concerned.

The following factors should weigh in declaration of contraction/ closure of relief operation. The actual point at which relief operation can safely be closed down will depend on the severity of the crop failure. Where there has been a serious failure of *Ahu* crop it will usually be necessary to continue relief measures till the next Rabi crop is reaped and where there is a failure of *Bao* crop relief should usually be continued till such time as DC in consultation with the Commissioner may decide. In other cases, relief measures should not normally be allowed to continue longer then the situation demands. The process of gradual closure of works should normally begin as soon as the demand for field employment sets in. Also, the physical condition of the people and the extent to which private employment is available and wages earned thereby

5) DC will submit a comprehensive report immediately after the closure of the flood relief operations in the district to the Government in the Revenue and Disaster Management

Department through the Commissioner of Division Submit details of the loses and damages in the prescribed formats for submission of request of assistance to Government of India, if required Every concerned line department will prepare and submit plans and estimates regarding damaged infrastructure for consideration under SDRF as per the procedures laid down
